A Note from Pastor Melodye...

As I type this from my dining room table, I observe two of my cats basking in the sunshine in front of the glass doors leading out to the parsonage deck. Happy, content, not a care in the world. They have a safe place to live, food, water and clean litter – until they dirty it! And then I clean it and again – all is right in Cat World!

The last few weeks for most of us have probably not been that carefree! Staying at home in this season of Covid-19 continues to be an interesting blend of dislocation and anxiety mixed with the blessing of unstructured time. None of us expected us for our lives to change this quickly.

I have been reading a challenging book by Rev. Junius Dotson called "Soul Reset." As the information states on the Cokesbury website:

"Everything was going fine . . . until it wasn't. For Reverend Junius B. Dotson it took an actual breakdown during a funeral for him to realize he needed a reset. As he recalls his own journey through grief, depression, burnout, and emotional breakdown, Dotson is passionate about calling for a Soul Reset for pastors, church leaders, and all disciples of Jesus Christ."

We rely so much on our own strength and abilities to get through life. For me, this time of Social Distancing is helping me realize anew that we all need a balance of work, rest, play, worship, exercise, and eating well—spiritual practices that keep our souls hydrated and healthy as we do the work of the church in the world.

Starting on May 10, I would like us as a congregation to concentrate on resetting our own souls using "Soul Reset" as our focus.

- Beginning on Sunday, May 10, our next six weeks of worship will emphasize the different themes of this book, giving us spiritual practices and practical guides to "reset" ourselves during and after this difficult time of pandemic.
- I will be offering studies of this book in two ways:
 - Through Zoom Meeting, an online process for people to meet together. Several of us have been using Zoom to finish up our Lenten study, and it's been a positive experience! Zoom can be used with your phone OR your computer.
 - If the "stay home" directives are lifted, we can also meet in person to study this book together.
- I will also be offering short daily devotional based on Soul Reset on Facebook and YouTube using this book.

If you would like to order "Soul Reset", the cost is \$15.00. The church will order them from Cokesbury. Please email the church or call me personally (517-250-1879) for us to order them for you. You can pick them up at the church after May 4th on Tuesdays during the God's Works meals.

Our situation with the "lockdown" is very fluid. We don't know when we will be gathering together again for physical worship. But God is with us in all of our life circumstances. God is faithful!

General Conference rescheduled for 2021: The world-wide meeting of the United Methodist Church that



was scheduled to take place in early May, 2020 in Minneapolis, Minnesota has been canceled. General Conference organizers are exploring potential new dates in 2021 for The United Methodist Church's top legislative assembly after the coronavirus pandemic forced postponement. The Commission on the General Conference determined that multiple factors meant it would not be feasible to reschedule the international 10-day gathering this year. "These issues include the undetermined length of the pandemic, uncertainty around travel bans in different areas of the world, delays in processing visas due to government and business closures and other questions," Kim Simpson, commission chair, said in a statement. At this point, the commission does not have specific dates to announce.

Michigan Annual Conference postponed: The original plan was for the Michigan Annual Conference to meet in Traverse City from May 28 – May 31. The Commission on the Annual Conference Session has announced a postponement of Annual Conference due to COVID-19 concerns. The Commission continues to monitor CDC and government guidelines. A new plan will be announced by May 1.

Stewardship: Faith Turns the Key and Unlocks the Door

The vast majority of people like to excel at something. Most of us like to do what we do in a manner that is truly first-class. Whether we are involved in one of the trades, or whether we are working in a profession, we like to excel in what we do. Similarly, in the Christian life, most of us like to demonstrate our love for the Lord in ways that will reflect properly on him and that will bring honor to him. As the Lord's servants, we take great care that our Christian service is of such quality that what we do for his sake is first-class. Thus, whether we sing a solo in a worship service at church, prepare a meal for someone who is a shut-in, or teach a Bible class, we strive to do what we do for God in the very best way possible. The Apostle Paul indicates we are also to excel in the grace of giving. "Now as you excel in everything — in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in utmost eagerness, and in our love for you — so we want you to excel also in this generous undertaking" (2 Cor. 8:7). In other words, just as we might seek to excel in other ways which demonstrate our Christian faith in action, we are also to excel in the grace of giving. In the context of the verse we just read, Paul commends the Macedonian Christians for giving as much as they were able and more. When we follow their example, we experience "grace giving" in action, not only giving as we are able, but also, giving beyond our ability. This is possible only as we demonstrate the fruit of the Christian life by the power of the Holy Spirit within us. As we step out by faith (which is one of the signs of a Spirit-controlled life), we are able to give in ways which might seem improbable or impossible at first. The Spirit of God thereby motivates us and compels us to excel in the grace of giving! One anonymous writer penned these powerful words: "God has a storehouse of blessings. Prayer is the key to that storehouse. But faith both turns the key and unlocks the door." Say, are you excelling in the grace of giving? If not, why not take God at his Word — by faith — and begin today?
