Services will look much like they did in the summer when we worshiped together. Here are a couple reminders of what Worship will look like for now:

- 1. Those in person will use bulletins, but we will not have hymnals or bibles in the pews.
- 2. We will continue to livestream the service on Facebook and post on Youtube later.
- 3. We will be doing contact tracing.
- 4. Please clear out of the building after Worship.
- 5. We ask that everyone wear a face mask.
- 6. There will be no children's church, Sunday School, or nursery.
- 7. Seating in pews will be spaced as before.

We will also open the building for small group and committee meetings on the

21st. Each room will have a maximum occupancy number posted on the door. Please reach out if you have any further questions or concerns.

Lenten Sermon Series & Weekly Study:

This year our Lenten series are based on "Entering the Passion of Jesus: A Beginner's Guide to Holy Week" by Dr. Amy-Jill Levine.

Jesus' final days were full of risk. Every move he made was filled with anticipation, danger, and the potential for great loss or great reward.

Jesus risked his reputation when he entered Jerusalem in a victory parade. He risked his life when he dared to teach in the Temple. His followers risked everything when they left behind their homes, or anointed him with costly perfume. We take risks as we read and reread these stories, finding new meanings and new challenges.

In Entering the Passion of Jesus: A Beginner's Guide to Holy Week, author, professor, and biblical scholar Amy-Jill Levine explores the biblical texts surrounding the Passion story. She shows us how the text raises ethical and spiritual questions for the reader, and how we all face risk in our Christian experience.

Amy-Jill Levine is University Professor of New Testament and Jewish Studies and Mary Jane Werthan Professor of Jewish Studies at Vanderbilt Divinity School and College of Arts and Sciences. An internationally renowned scholar and teacher, she is the author of numerous books including *The Misunderstood Jew: The Church and the Scandal of the Jewish Jesus* and *The Meaning of the* Bible: What the Jewish Bible and the Christian Old Testament Can Teach Us. She is also the co-editor of the Jewish Annotated New Testament.

The book's six chapters include:

- Jerusalem: Risking Reputation
- The Temple: Risking Righteous Anger
- Teachings: Risking Challenge
- The First Dinner: Risking Rejection
- The Last Supper: Risking the Loss of Friends

• Gethsemane: Risking Temptation

Each Sunday beginning February 17th we will base our worship on one chapter. Each Wednesday we will explore the same theme in more depth.





All workers will be trained Red Cross members who will follow CDC guidelines on sterilization and social distancing.
