

From Pastor Melodye...



These are anxious times for so many of us. COVID-19 has changed so much of what we do on a fundamental level. We limit how we act and where we go. Masks can now be a political statement – or a fashion accessory. We no longer shake hands or give hugs. Some of us even have a favorite brand of hand sanitizer. (Mine is "Aromatherapy Stress Relief" from Bath and Body Works!)

Life here at St. Paul's is vastly different than when I first was appointed here as your pastor a little more than a year ago. Our worship space is marked off for social distancing. Our Choirs are not singing – and probably

will not "make a joyful noise" until sometime in 2021. Our Nursery is closed, and our Christ's Kids Group and UMYF Youth Group are waiting to reconvene until life is healthier and safer.

However, the need to be connected to each other is stronger than it ever has been. Our worship is shared on Facebook Live and YouTube. We still share brown bag meals through Gods Works on Tuesday nights. And we are still offering some limited ways for Adult education.

Our Worship theme from August 30 through the month of September is "Finding Peace in an Anxious World." The book of Proverbs and "The Serenity Prayer" will be our guides to help us find our way through anxiety, worry, and fear and move towards God's peace that surpasses all understanding. This theme is based on the 2020 United Methodist Women Spiritual Growth Study by the staff at the Urban Village Church in Chicago.

Using "The Serenity Prayer" as a scaffold, "Finding Peace in an Anxious World" explores ways to discover peace through scriptural and spiritual disciplines so that we can be rooted in God and energized to live fully as disciples of Christ.

Saint Paul's UMC Worship Committee met on August 11th to discuss ideas to make worship a more engaging and meaningful experience. We reviewed the Worship Survey from last Fall and have decided to continue with one worship service at 9:30 AM. This will be reconsidered after the COVID-19 pandemic has been controlled. Our plan is to return to using liturgists and acolytes on Sunday, September 13.

We are happy to report that the church wi-fi has been upgraded and should be available throughout the church. This will greatly enhance our live streaming of services. Many thanks to our office staff Cathy Butson and Jeanette Fedosky for handling this for the church.

Organ Update: Work continues on our wonderful pipe organ and should be completed sometime in early September.

While working on the instrument it was discovered that some additional work needs to be done to ensure our organ performs without problems for the foreseeable future. This additional work will add \$1,465.00 bringing the total cost up to \$34,465.00. Through your generous donations we have raised \$33,300.00 so we are almost there. Please consider continuing your offerings for the organ for a little longer. The people of St Paul's have always been generous and risen to the call for funds. Thank you for supporting this project.

For those not yet comfortable worshiping in person, Communion will be offered in a different manner. Pastor Melodye will be in the church parking lot at 5:30 PM on the same Sunday that Communion is given during worship. After you park, stay in the car, roll

down your window, and Pastor Melodye will pray with you and offer you the consecrated bread and the juice in a safe manner. This will begin Sunday, September 6th.


If you would like Holy Communion brought to your home, please contact the church office and schedule an appointment. Pastor Melodye will come to visit you with Communion.

healthy...absolutely. We could not have predicted the Earthquake on August 21 in Monroe County, but we can plan and keep moving forward doing, creating and keeping safety accommodations (masks, social distancing, frequent hand washing, no food or drink) in mind during the COVID pandemic.

Our Christian Education work area closely follows Monroe Public Schools (MPS) protocols and schedules. When MPS closes for inclement weather, we follow their lead to cancel our activities. We've developed a scale based on the State of Michigan "Safe Start Plan" Phases and back to school plans MPS is using to return to in-person gathering.

Phase B Activity Information for Fall 2020

Nursery: Services are not provided at this time.

Children & Youth: No children or youth Sunday School will be held, until Phase C. Sunday School for children is currently virtual online at the "Children's Ministries Group" of the St. Paul's Facebook Page. Confirmation for 7th-9th grades will be held in person January thru May 2021. Christ's Kids and UMYF (United Methodist Youth Fellowship) will have a few scheduled outdoor events and Zoom calls to reunite. No children or youth choirs will meet.

Adults: Sunday school and small gatherings with social distancing and mask wearing will be permitted. New small groups are encouraged, so see Alisha Cooley or Pastor Melodye for ideas and resources. Pastor Melodye will begin a Book Study beginning September 13 with three offerings: 10:30am on Sundays after worship, on Wednesdays via Zoom, and another gathering outdoors at IHM Gazebo. Books are available in hard copy and on Kindle. Contact office for more information.

Events: Most events such as book sales, UMW meetings and salad luncheons will not be held this Fall. Watch Facebook and the newsletter for other favorite activities we will be doing in different ways.

Drive thru Back to School Blessings will be held on Sunday, September 6 in the church parking lot from 4-5PM. Come students and teachers! Last names beginning with the letters A-M are asked to drive in from 4-4:30pm; letters N-Z 4:30-5pm. Enter the parking lot from Monroe Street, take a hard right to form a line going around the parking lot, and ultimately end with the blessing for each family taking place in front of the Fellowship Hall doors.

We need to take care of each other in these uncertain times. St. Paul's is working hard to continue to give its members an opportunity to keep in touch with each other and share Jesus' love with others.
